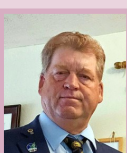

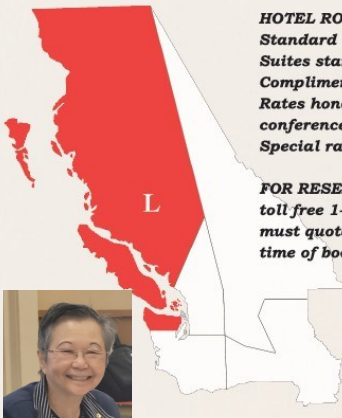

The Club sold Christmas Trees to raise money

Club sold books and quilting samples at Trail Bay Mall in Sechelt Nov. 25 and 30. Most of the books belonged to Jim Brookes, our beloved Secretary Treasurer who passed away two years ago, We are also selling quilting and samples donated by his wife Kerrin Brookes, who is not a Lion yet, and she set up and worked at the booth both days. She made \$600. Which she donated to the Club's Activity Fund.



Every Saturday, we run a "Gift Card / Meat Draw" at the Lighthouse Pub in Sechelt from 2 - 4 pm. We raffle 10 - \$20. Claytons Gift Certificates 3 - \$50. Lighthouse gift Cards which the Lighthouse Pub donates, and a Prime Rib Roast valued at approximately \$100. To date, we are \$3,594 ahead of last year to date. The reintroduction of meat has helped with the increased sales. For our December 16 event, we will be raffling 6 turkeys, 6 hams and 6 \$50. Lighthouse Gift Cards.

Members brought warm jackets and other warm clothing to our Lions Meeting Room. Also, Tenants in our Seniors Housing Project - Greencourt - donated a large number of items. The Club also donated \$500. to purchase underwear and socks for the homeless. All the items were delivered to the Sechelt RainCity Shelter and were much appreciated. In our local newspaper, - Kisses and Kicks Section - the following thank you was inserted by a grateful individual "A huge bucket full of kisses to the Sunshine Coast Lions club and Greencourt for their generous donations to the RainCity Shelter"



Our Lions Club arranged for the construction of a ramp at the front entrance of one of our Lions members, as he was unable to go out due to the three steps at the front of the house. We looked at building the ramp ourselves, but decided to hire a professional to ensure the ramp would be completely safe. Cost was \$1,144.

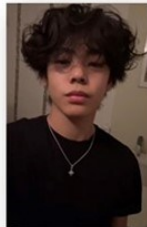

The Victoria Lions 8th Annual Soup Can Project



Our project is led by Lion George Schellenberg who reports "This has been our Victoria Lions Club 8th Annual Soup Can Project and by far the biggest and most successful and growing each year. (Thanks for all the generous donations). The Club collects donations from Lions Club Members in lieu of



giving Christmas Gifts to each other at the Annual Christmas Dinner.

We delivered 67 cases of assorted cans of Campbell's Soup plus 3 cases (36 cans) of Chunky Stews for total cost of \$1,123.00 that was purchased at the Country Grocer, Royal Oak.



Lois & Alice took photographs using Lion Susan's phone at the Country Grocer with the group and Manager of the store at our pick up stop. Then we proceeded to the Community Kitchen at the other end and there to meet us as we arrived with Lion Terry's pick-up Truck Load were Lions Jim, Don & Lois, Anne, Meghan, Susan, Denise, Kim Cummins, Director of Operations and Clarice Dillman, Board Chair of the Society.

All told over 500 pounds delivered to stock their shelves. It should be noted and acknowledged that Country Grocer, Royal Oak has been very kind and accommodating to us giving us a "Deep Discount" and in addition contribute some extra cases of soup at no charge. They are a local Grocer who contribute much back to the community and we thank them for their partnership.

This idea and endeavour was started in 2015 by Past Lion Mari Hall and Lion George. Our first 2 years the Soup Products were delivered to the Salvation Army (Stan Hagen Centre as our original beneficiary). In 2017, we recommended as the Broad to our Lions Club that we switch the annual Soup Donation to a new Beneficiary called the "Shelbourne Community Kitchen Society", a fairly new upstart volunteer Resource Centre operating out of a small house on Shelbourne St. providing a variety of food skills and cooking programs to the community. Since that time to date, we have provided them with approximately 2,500 cans of soup product. In addition to that we have supported them through annual donations amounting in total to approximately \$15,000.00!!

Today the Shelbourne Community Kitchen has within a few years grown into a dynamic resource centre that provides food services to approx. 1,500 Adults and 500 Children. They are about to open their new Commercial Kitchen to increase capacity and provide participants to learn and cook together, share community meals and host canning and preservation workshops. The food centre is also provided with the majority of fresh produce from two gardens from May to September."

Clarice Dillman, Board Chair of the Shelbourne Community Kitchen made a statement to our Victoria Lions Club: "Thank you for the great photos of the amazing Victoria Lions Club Soup Can Drive. It was so gratifying to see the incredible results of this soup can drive and have our shelves filled up with 65 cases! Kim and I enjoyed having the opportunity to chat with so many who turned out and to say thank you in person. The ongoing support, first from the Gordon Head Lions Club and now the Victoria Lions Club, means so much to us. Truly a community endeavour!

Back seven years ago, the family gratefully welcomed Flyy, a golden retriever, into their home. Trained specifically at the Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guide's headquarters in Oakville, Ontario, Flyy is now nearing his working years as a dog guide. Flyy will be retired to another welcoming family, his working days moving into retirement.

Almost seamlessly, a new member of the family will take Flyy's place with Allister, and continue to support this young fellow of 15 years as he goes about his days, bringing calm and more independence no one could have imagined. 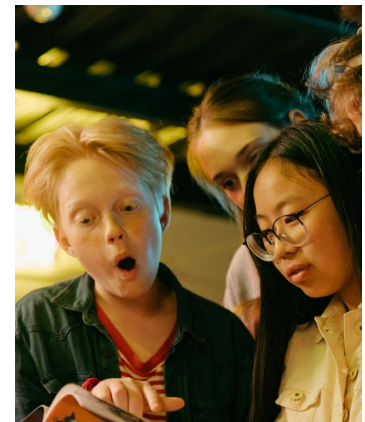
