### MD19 LIONS AND CARE

MD19 Lions began its affiliation with CARE in 1951, by supporting CARE's relief efforts through Lions Clubs International. During the fifties Lions Clubs International operated humanitarian projects in developing countries similar to CARE's projects. MD19 Lions determined that CARE, with its ability to leverage additional funds, was able to provide services at one-third the cost of the Lions' projects.

MD19 Lions entered into an agreement with the Northwest CARE office in 1958 to provide direct support of CARE projects chosen by the group. For several years this relationship was unique among Lions Clubs, and attracted attention because of its success.

The MD19 Lions Council of Governors, at its annual meeting, selects a CARE project to be supported by MD19 Lions for the following year. Over the years MD19 Lions have been strong supporters of education, health care, agriculture and water systems, with a special focus on Latin American countries.



**Brian E. Sheehan,** from Bird Island, Minnesota, USA, was elected to serve as international president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 104th International Convention, June 22 through June 28, 2022.



As of July 11, 2023, he is serving as Chairperson for Lions Clubs

International Foundation (LCIF) through June 25, 2024.

Past International President Sheehan is the founder and CEO of Rural Computer Consultants, a software development company.

A member of the Bird Island Lions Club since 1991, he has held many offices within the association, including council chairperson, long range planning chairperson, membership chairperson, retention chairperson, women's initiative chairperson, MD convention chairperson, GMT Liaison and GLT area leader. He has also served as the chairperson of the Headquarter Operation & Finance Committee, Lions University coordinator, DGE group leader, and board appointee to several committees including Constitutions and Bylaws, LCIF Executive, LCI Executive, USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum and the

Centennial Action committees.

He has been a presenter at numerous Lions events, including many of the Global Forums. In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards including Club Lion of the Year; the District 5M 4 Diabetes Awareness Award; the MD 5M Web Site Appreciation Award; the MD 5M Al Jensen Leadership Award; the Founders Membership Growth Award; numerous International President's Certificates of Appreciation; International President's Leadership Award; multiple International President's Awards; and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members.

He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow and Second Century Ambassador. In addition to his Lions activities, Past International President Sheehan is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He has served as president of Bird Island Civic and Commerce, director of the Learning Funhouse and as a member of various school committees. He also received the 2011 U.S. SBA Minnesota Small Business Person of the Year Award. Past International President Sheehan and his wife, Lori, also a Lion and Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, have two sons and two daughters. And in their spare time, they have enjoyed raising many types of exotic animals.

### **Melvin Jones Fellowship**

Contributions for the MJF can be made by individuals (including non-Lions), clubs or districts. Donations may be in one sum or in installments. Melvin Jones Fellows receive a special lapel pin, a plaque and a congratulatory letter.

### **Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowships**

The Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship (PMJF) program is a way for donors to extend their commitment to LCIF. There are 54 recognition levels beyond the initial US\$1,000 MJF contribution with a unique pin for each giving level. After contributing US\$100,000, donors become Humanitarian Partners.

**Judge Brian Stevenson,** of Calgary, Alberta, Canada, was elected to serve as President of The International Association of Lions Clubs following his election at the association's 70th International Convention, held in Taipei, Taiwan, Republic of China, July 1-4, 1987.

He served in private law practice and as a special prosecutor in the Canadian Department of Justice. In 1974, he was appointed for life as a Judge to the Provincial Court of Alberta.

A Lion since 1966, he has held numerous offices. These include terms as district governor, a member of the association's board of directors from 1977-79 and as a presidential appointee to the international board from 1979-81 and again from 1998-1999. He also served a three-year term as the chairman of Campaign SightFirst, one of the largest and

most successful fundraising campaigns in the


history of the association.

In recognition of his many contributions, he has received numerous awards including the 100% District Governor Award, the Membership Advancement Key, 18 International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor granted by the association to its members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his work as a Lion, Past President Stevenson has served as president of the Calgary Social Planning Council, as a board member of the Calgary United Way and as a member of the City of Calgary Social Services Committee.

He has also served as president of the Alberta Provincial Judges Association and as chairman of the International Year of Disabled Persons Committee for the Province of Alberta. In 1996, the City of Calgary recognized his numerous voluntary contributions by awarding him the Grant MacEwan Lifetime Achievement Award of Merit.

Past President Stevenson is a member of numerous professional organizations and has authored a number of articles on legal matters. He and his wife, Patricia, have four daughters, eight granddaughters and two grandsons.



### **Judge Brian Stevenson Fellowship**

Judge Brian Stevenson Fellowship is to recognize Lions and other deserving recipients, PIP Judge Brian Stevenson has endorsed this fellowship. The recipient receives a medallion, lapel pin and signed certificate.

### **Progressive Judge Brian Stevenson Fellowship**

This fellowship is a way to further honour someone who has received a Judge Brian Stevenson Fellowship. It is one of the greatest honours that can be bestowed within Lionism in Canada. The recipient receives a gold bar pin to be worn on the white ribbon of the Judge Brian Stevenson medallion as well as a lapel pin with ruby and a personalized certificate.




### **Granisle Lions Club**



### Report on District 19L's Lions Day: Diabetes Awareness "Walk 10K Steps A Day"

In Canada, there are more than 11.7 million people living with Diabetes or Prediabetes undiagnosed, 5.7 million diagnosed. Diabetes complications can lead to many health problems such as cardiovascular disease, renal disease, strokes, kidney failure, blindness or reducing lifespan by 5-15 years and so on.

November is the Month of Diabetes Awareness. Lions District 19L organized an Event called **Lions Day: Diabetes Awareness "Walk 10K Steps A Day"** on November 12, 2023 in the Aberdeen Centre which is the largest shopping mall in the City of Richmond. The District aimed at raising the diabetes awareness and prevention, advocating healthy living and diet, as well as cultivating people's habit of daily walking. The Event invited the Lions Clubs and the public to join a pleasant walk together on a Sunday morning.

Participating Lions Clubs and individuals donated CAD\$50 and CAD\$5 respectively. All proceeds were donated to Diabetes Canada to fund critical research to bring patients closer to a cure and to offer support services and education resources to help people with diabetes live better. On the Event Day, there was an Award system with prizes for the Most Steps Achieved by the top 3 individuals and Lions Clubs to encourage more participation.

The District 19L received on stage greetings from the Representatives of the local city, provincial and federal levels at the Opening Ceremony. Over 200 participants joined the Start of the Walk led by the District 19L District Governor Elaine Luk, other Lions dignitaries and the government officials. Representatives from the media also attended and reported on the Event on the TV daily news, local newspaper and radio stations.

Two scheduled Workshops on Diabetes hosted by a renowned family doctor also took place on the stage. Audience was very enthusiastic in the Q&A section and have found the information very useful. Free blood glucose and blood pressure were offered to the participants and the public by a clinic nearby during the Event day.

Furthermore, in order to create more fun and attraction, Lions and Leos were invited to perform on stage and followed by a Prize Presentation to the walk winners and a lucky draw towards the end of the Event. The audience was amazed by the talents of these Lions and the chance to win the grand prizes.

Despite the focus is on the subject of Diabetes, yet the District has also promoted the newly named **Lions District 19L** (after the merger of 2 districts) and the five **Global Causes** through the Event. There were exhibition booths on DIABETES, VISION (to collect used eyeglasses), HUNGER (to collect non-perishable food for Food Bank), ENVIRONMENT and CHILDHOOD CANCER with distribution of promotional materials and video showing the community services of Lions. These are all under the mandate of District GST.


