MEET FABRÍCIO OLIVEIRA FIRST VICE PRESIDENT

Fabrício Oliveira of Catolé do Rocha, Paraiba, Brazil, was elected to serve as first vice president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 105th International Convention, July 7 through July 11, 2023.

Vice President Fabrício is a businessman, with a Post-Graduate Degree in Business Administration (MBA) from Fundação Getúlio Vargas (FGV), and a Degree in Administration.

A member of the Catolé do Rocha Lions Club since 1985, Vice President Fabrício has held many offices within the association, including club president, zone chairperson, region chairperson, district governor, council chairperson, and international director. He has also served as district LCIF chair, SightFirst committee chair, leadership development chair, multiple district DGE seminar coordinator and chair of the district Lions Foundation. Vice President Fabrício also served twice as District Governors-Elect Seminar group leader.

In recognition of his service to the association he has received numerous awards, including the 100% Club President Award, an Extension Award for organizing nine new Lions clubs, District Governor Excellence Award, 19 International President's Certificates of Appreciation, the Paradigm Award, nine Leadership Awards, 14 International President's Awards, International Director Recognition Award and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association to its members. He has also received a Key Award for helping induct thirty new Lions members, an Extension Certificate for sponsoring five new Leo clubs, Global Vision Medal for his SightFirst efforts and a LCIF Helping Hands Award. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He previously served as the Secretary of Industry and Commerce of the State of Paraiba and an administration council chairperson of several

companies, as director of the National Confederation of Shopkeepers, chair of the Federation of Shopkeepers of the State of Paraiba, chair of the Chamber of Shopkeepers of Catolé do Rocha and chair of Manoel Vitoriano de Freitas Foundation supporting institution of the Children's Hospital Erninia Evangelista.

New LCIF President LCIF Donation Pins!

How to receive these pins and the donation amounts to earn them.

You would need to email <u>DonorAssistance@lionsclub.org</u> and request each pin once you have made a single donation of the following amounts:

- The first level is the Bronze Pin. Lions are eligible for the Bronze Pin upon receipt of a single donation in the amount of \$50 to \$99.99 (US \$).
- The second level is the Silver Pin. Lions are eligible for the Silver Pin upon receipt of a single donation in the amount of \$100 to \$199.99 (US \$).
- The third level is the Gold Pin. Lions are eligible for the Gold Pin upon receipt of a single donation in the amount of \$200 and above (US \$).

The pins are based on a single donation instead of a cumulative donation.







SPECIAL FEATURE – District I Lions and Wild Fires

With hundreds of fires burning around BC, August 18, 2023 a "State of Emergency" was declared. I reached out to Lions Clubs in the areas. Here are some reports from them.



Reporting for Vernon area, is Club President Trudy Parke Vernon is doing well although the lightning storm that's come up from Kelowna will have me up all night watching the dry hills. Other than the heavy smoke outside, things are going along as normal around here. There is an evacuation Center set up at our arena but radio said it is set up with lots



of help and needs nothing. The EOC is so organized, we'd get in the way. That could be something our club could discuss.

Reporting for Peachland area, is President Steve Sweeney

The Westbank Lions joining with the Peachland Lions was asked by the Salvation Army to cook breakfast and lunch for evacuees at the West Kelowna Emergency Support Services Reception Centre. Over 3000 households were evacuated. While most are staying with friends and family there is still a considerable number of people requiring shelter and food.

Spearheaded by the Salvation Army disaster response team the Lions were tasked with preparing approximately 250 breakfasts and an equal number of lunches.



Most supplies were donated with Save-on-Foods providing a tremendous amount of the food required.

This is a difficult time for the evacuees as many don't yet know the status of their homes. It is known that well over 100 structures have been lost. Despite the circumstances most people are incredibly grateful for the support provided by all the volunteer agencies involved.

Reporting for Westbank Lions Club is President Leonard Thordarson

Ferocious Fires erupted in West Kelowna Thursday August 17. The McDougall Creek Fire now at 12,000 hectares. Friday August 18 there were 2400 properties on Evacuation Order and 4800 properties on Alert. The morning following the outbreak the Westbank Lions President Len Thordarson, went to the Salvation Army, who were put in charge of caring for those displaced at the West Kelowna Evacuation Center to ask what the Westbank Lions could do to assist.



The biggest need was to provide breakfast and lunch: with the Lions BBQ trailer we had the means and opportunity to assist. Friday we provided over 300 lunches. And Every day since then, we have served Breakfast and lunch with an average of 400 plus meals per day so as of today's date we served almost 3000 meals. Once we had set up on site, there was a call out to the Peachland Lions to assist. What a valuable club, President Steve Sweeny and the members are so willing to assist and honestly our small club would not have been able to do as many days or serve as many meals to the public.

The Westbank Rotary Club asked to assist along with Brain Trust and the West Kelowna Youth Ambassadors. Partnerships are so critical in times of need and the Westbank Lions are so grateful for all the support.

190 structures have been lost, most from the same neighbourhoods there will be many whose lives will be changed forever by this disaster. On a positive note, Fire Chief Jason Brolund advises that the fire has taken a turn for the better, with cooler weather and no wind and they have saved over 3000 homes.

Our community is overwhelmed by the Emergency Service Support. Driving by the Fire and Rescue command center you see vehicles, men and women from all over BC and beyond. We give our thanks and gratitude to all the Firefighters, Emergency Response teams, RCMP and all the volunteer organizations and their volunteers.

Several of our members are suffering from health issues themselves and cannot be outside with prolonged exposure to the smoke. Those of us who can are quietly assisting other groups and organizations however we can. As they say "once a volunteer, always a volunteer."

CYBER SECURITY!! - EMAIL GIFT CARD SCAMS

Hello Ron,

Are you available? I am currently out of town in a meeting. I forgot my CC at home and I would have not bothered you with this request. I want you to please handle this for me. DISTF donation to community welfare with patients and veterans against Covid, Can you confirm if you can get some today? I will need you to get 8 x 100 denominations of Visa Gift Card o online or at any convenience store. Kindly Let me know if you can do this today. You will take a snapshot of the front and back of the card showing the pin attached and email them to

Most of you will have received at least one email that **APPEARS** to be from someone you know. They may be asking for personal information or asking you to buy gift cards for them. **BEWARE**!!!!

The initial email may start out innocuously, asking if you are available, stating that they need a favor. Once you respond, the scammer will ask you to purchase gift cards, specifying the quantity and denomination. If you reply with the cards' codes, your money is now in the hands of the scammer. Gift cards are treated as cash, in many cases, cannot be refunded.

NO government agency (like CRA/IRS), business or non-profit organization will ask you to pay a bill, or make a donation using gift cards.

What should I do with suspicious emails?

- 1. Never click any links or attachments in suspicious emails. ...
- 2. If the suspicious message appears to come from a person you know, contact that person via some other means such as text message or phone call to confirm it.
 - A) Check the email address compare it with the email address you have in your contacts list. If it's not the same it's a **FRAUD**. **DO NOT RESPOND!**
- 3. Report the message (if it's coming from a business or government agency). Most business/government's have "report scam" information on their websites. Usually , they ask you to forward the email to them.
- 4. THEN DELETE IT.

If you have been the target of a telephone, internet, mail or other type of scam and unwittingly provided personal or financial information, contact the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre: by telephone at 1-888-495-8501 or. through their website.

NOTE: You may also receive a SMS (phone message) or Facebook message along the same lines, IT'S A SCAM. For SMS messages check out your service provider and see what they suggest you do. If it's Facebook, that means your friend has been hacked. They will have to create a new Facebook account. Always be vigilant the scammers are always coming up with something new.
