




We donated funds to Pineridge Elementary School to purchase 2 bread making machines. The machines will circulate between classes and provide a unique food-making opportunity for the students.




Our Lions had another busy but fun day Serving breakfast this morning at Charles Hays Secondary







Dear Duncan Lions.

Thanks for the donation of glasses. We do appreciate getting them. We have received $16\,1/2$ tons of glasses so far this year. Last year we processed 25 tons of glasses. Thanks for all your hard

We just bought a new forklift battery for under \$9,000. We do not have the exact bill yet. We bought a newer truck for \$31,500. So far this year we have received \$15,300 from BC, \$500 from Saskatchewan, \$3050 from Ontario and \$25,000 from Alberta clubs for a total of \$45,050 Nobody here gets paid a cent. In 2021-22 we lost \$40,001 and in 2022-23 we made \$66,970.15. It cost us about \$100,000 a year to operate.

We have shipped out 256, 970 pairs of glasses since June 16,2023. Last year we sent out about 195,000. This year's glasses have been shipped to Canadians that took them to: Dominican Republic, Ghana, Nigeria, Cuba, Ecuador, Morocco, Mexico, Philippines, Sierra Leone, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Guatemala, Morocco, Burkino Faso, Spain, Malawi, Colombia and Peru.

Spain makes it 101 countries that receive our glasses.
